There is a wide variety of educational advancement opportunities that a member would be able to apply for: advanced degrees, specialized endorsements, national board certification and other possibilities. Legislative Day

Sponsored by AZ Delta Kappa Gamma and All Arizona School Retirees Association

The annual **Legislative Day is scheduled for Friday, March 4th**, as a zoom meeting due to the health security (Covid) issues at the Arizona Capitol. Times for the zoom meeting is from 1:00pm to 4:00pm. We are asking the Senators and Representatives as well as the State Superintendent of Instruction to respond to one of two talking points.

- 1.At present there are over 2000 classrooms in Arizona with unfilled teacher vacancies or staffed with non-certified personnel. Arizona is ranked nationally at 49th out of 50 states for teacher salaries. How will you address these issues in the legislature this year?
- 2. We are very interested in the fiscal well-being of the Arizona State Retirement System (ASRS). As a legislator, what are your goals, interests and concerns about the ASRS? Do you believe it is important to support, protect and improve this defined benefit pension system for public sector employees in Arizona? What legislative actions would you sponsor and/or support to further these goals.

National Legislative Day

2023 International Conference

The International Executive Board approved the recommendation that Arizona, specifically the Phoenix area as an international conference site in 2023. The specific site has not been set but the Wild Horse Pass Sheraton and Kierland Westin are being considered. Having the conference in Arizona will not put extra duties on state members. The Executive board instead, now requests volunteers from all members attending the event to take on the conference responsibilities.

The second international conference will be held in Detroit, Michigan.
